


Hot Spots

of hockey. When the snow melts, and the ice is gone the skating rink will be turned into a grass volley ball court.





No Comment




Hall passes are required whenever you are in the halls during class time. Many teachers have got into the spirit by having some quite creative hall passes, such as Miss Kunz who has



One of the highlights of the season was their free throw shooting which was at 58%, the highest team percentage in Coach Teichert's 12 years of coaching.






They Got Uniforms AT LAST!!









the season, they pulled together and won the last game, and that shows real character.




