1991

Archibald Gardner was born in Scotland September 2, 1814 and migrated to Canada at the age of nine. A convert to the Mormon Church he crossed the plains arriving in the Salt Lake Valley October 1847. Known as the "Mill Builder" he came to Star Valley in 1889. He and his nephew Brigham, constructed a much needed Grist Mill and Lumber Mill, which was hydro-powered by Swift Creek and served the valley for many years. He left a legacy of honesty, ingenuity, community service and a large posterity unparalleled in the settlement of the Mountain West.

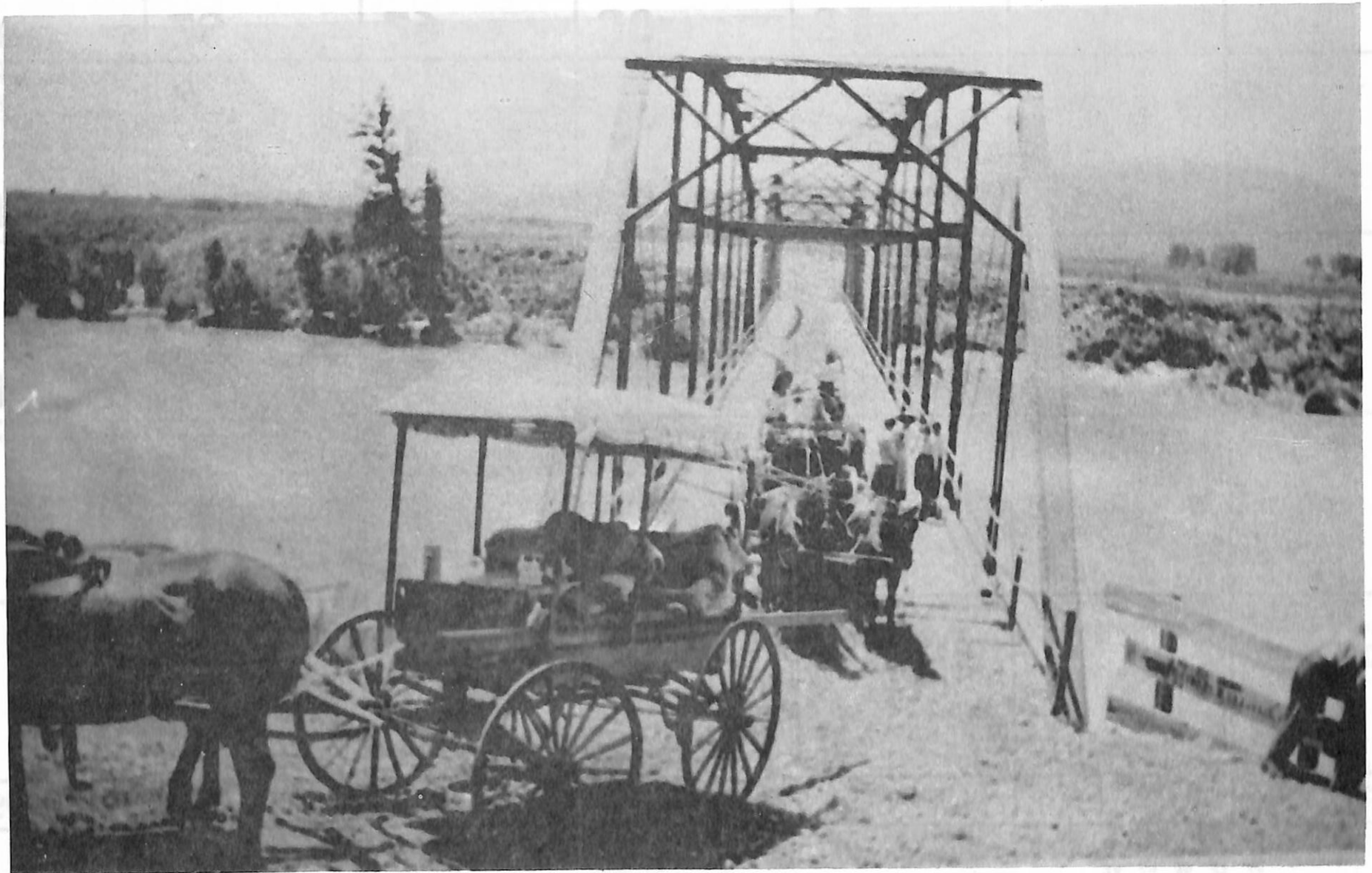

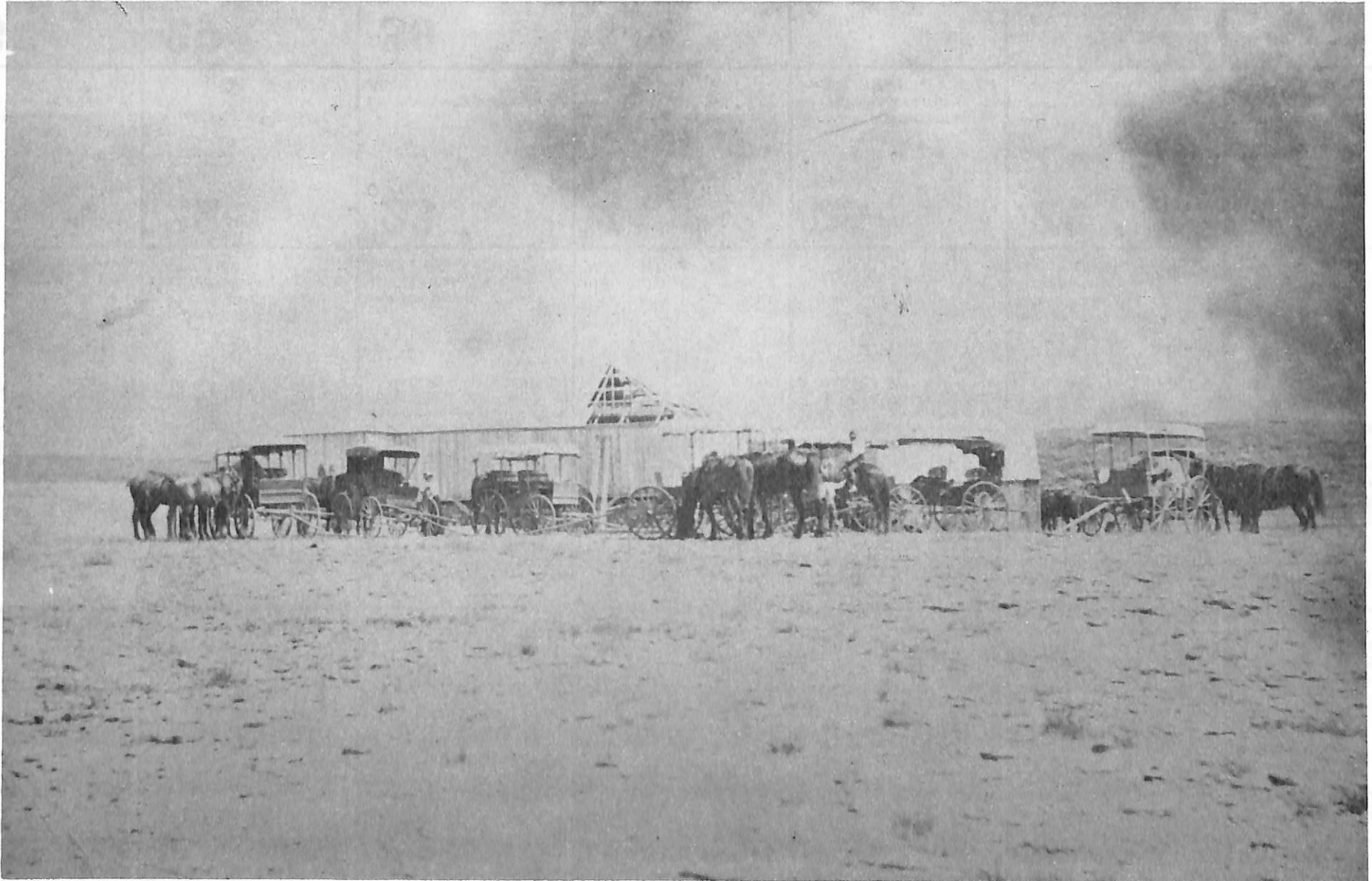

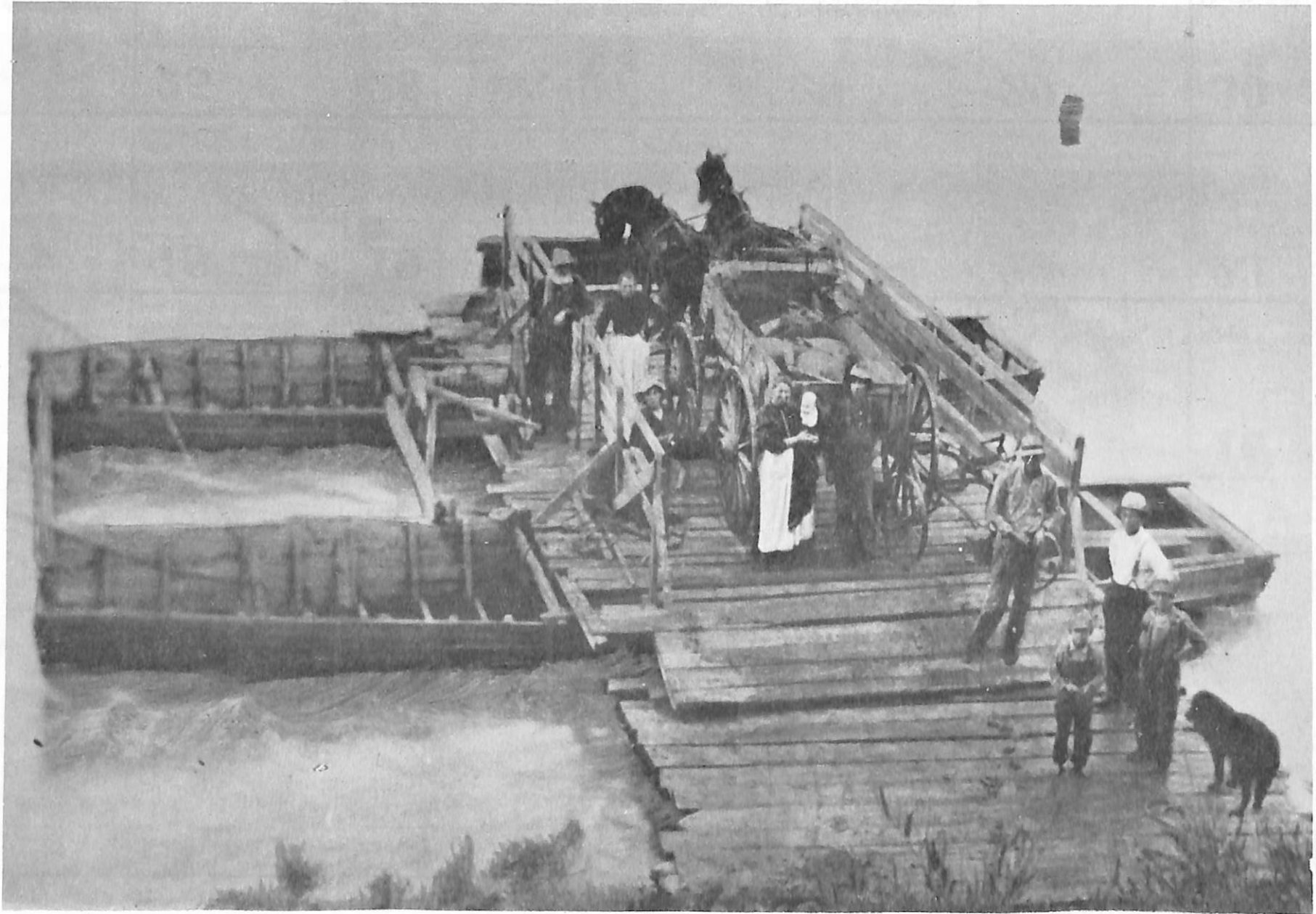

Another ferry was later built about a mile upstream from this one. The fee for one man was 25¢, fee for team and wagon was \$1.00.
