





Grant and Caroline Campbell were the first settlers in Fairview, in 1884. Their home was near the confluence of Spring Creek and Crow Creek. They reared 14 children of their own, plus two children given to them by immigrants who couldn't care for them, and also one Indian girl abandoned by her mother at their place.

FIRST STAR VALLEY HOSPITAL




