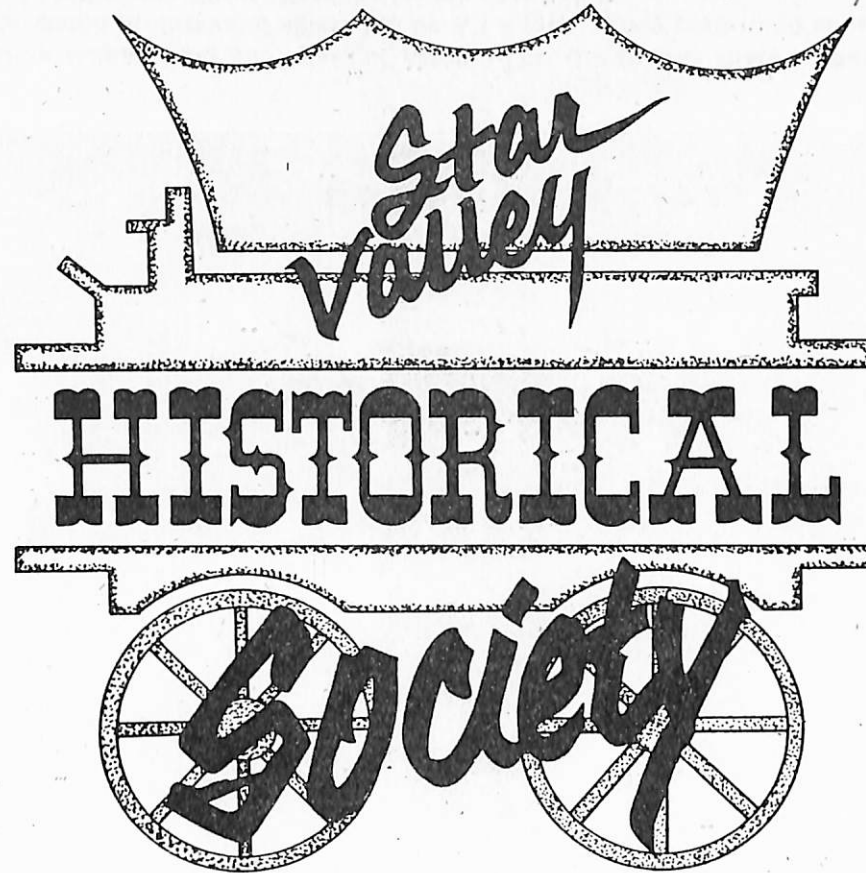

When the road changed to the south end of the valley, Afton became the place to stay.

FIRST STAR VALLEY HOSPITAL

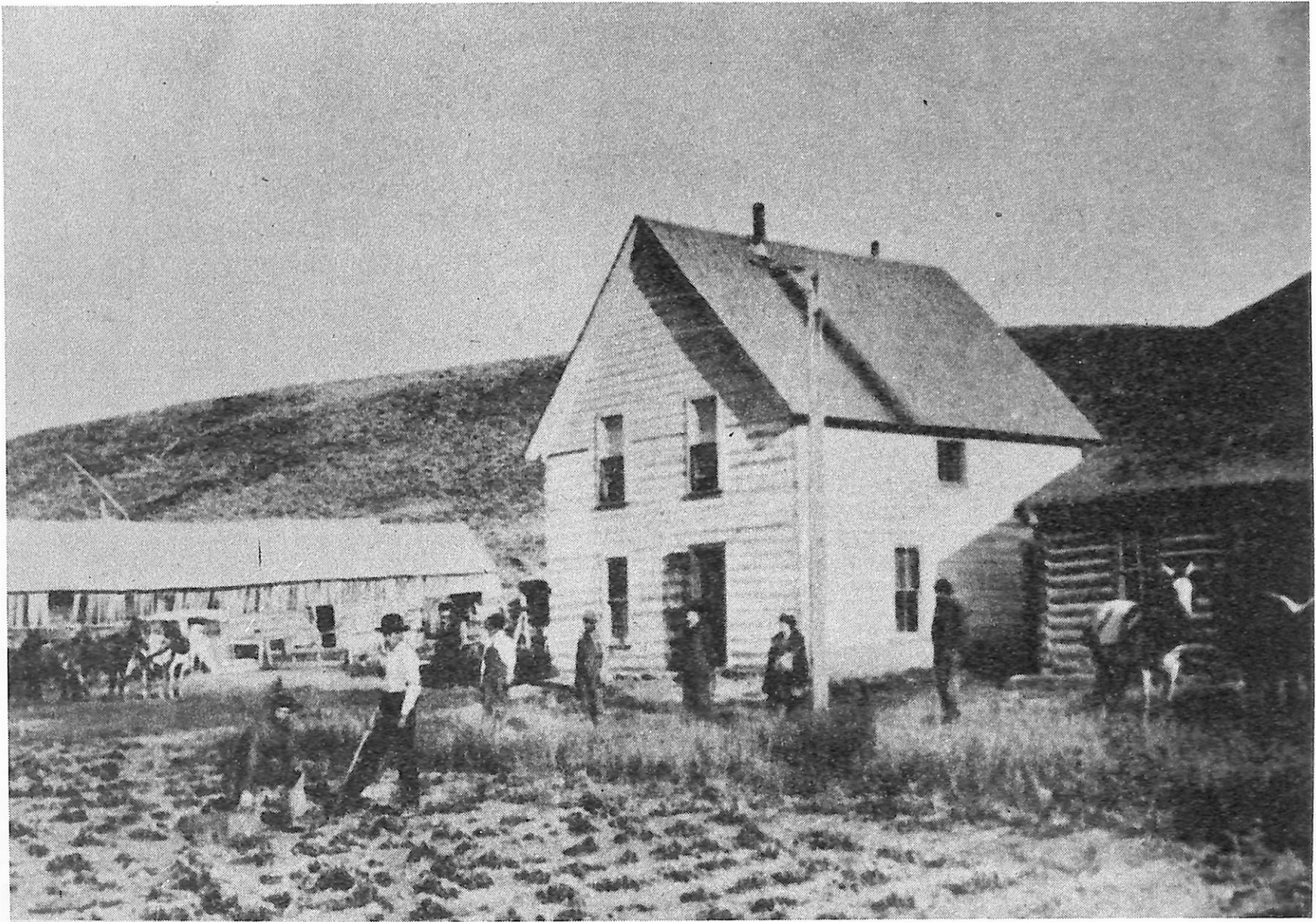

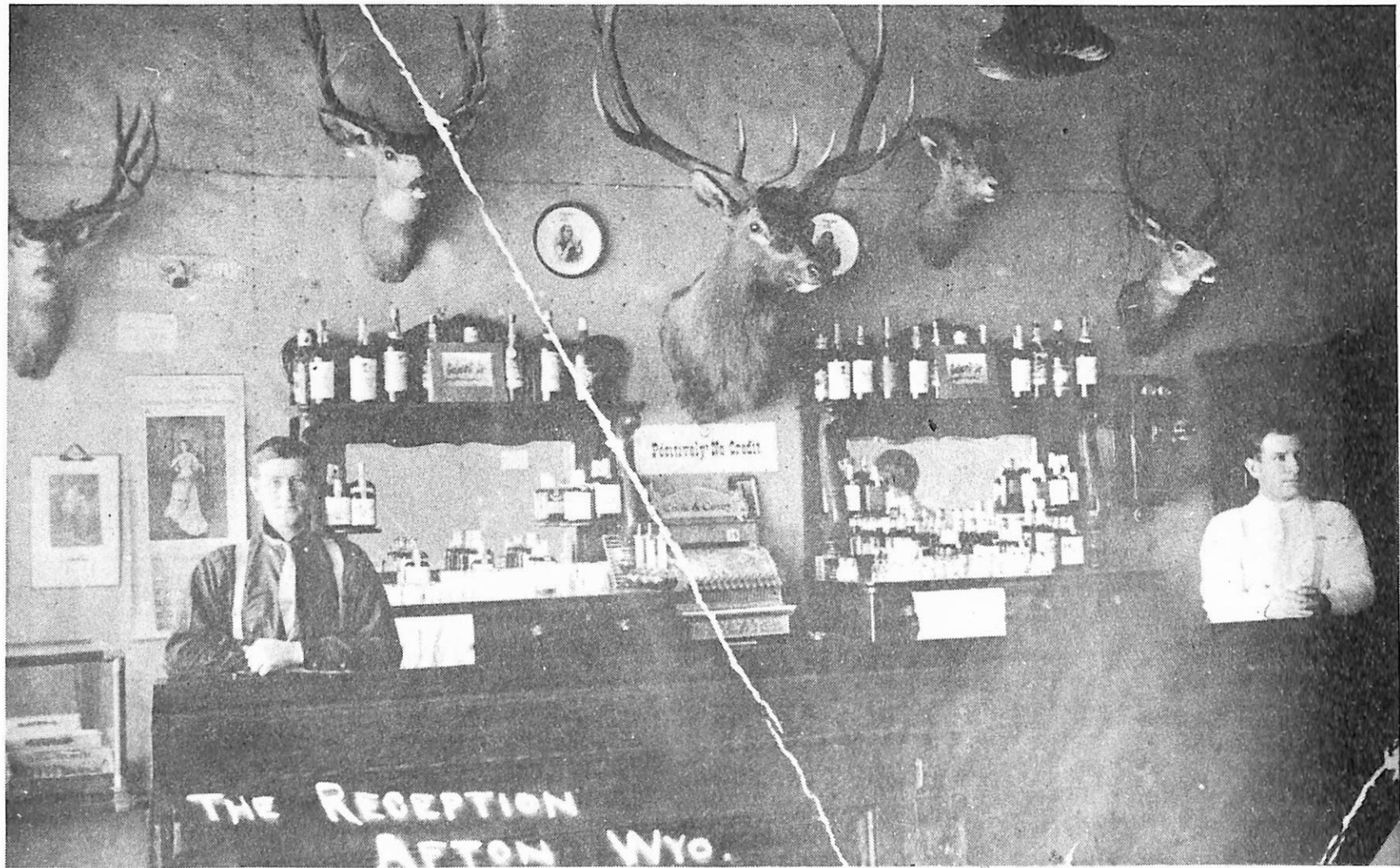
