The team this season finished conference play in a tie with Pinedale for third place; both teams having won three and lost five. Mt. View finished in first place, lyman in second place, and Big Finey last.

Competition this year was very much stronger from all teams in the Conference. The Panthers got off to a good start in winning from Kemmerer, Randolph and Superior; but faltered in mid-season and lost games which should have been won. Recovery from this slump was slow, but the team hit its stride again and finished strong against Lyman, Pinedale, Big Piney and Georgetown. It appeared that the boys were ready for the tournament and would be tough to beat. But the FLU laid them low a week previous to tourney play. That siege of illness was fatal to any tourney championship aspirations, as the team lost completely the ability to hit the hoop, and was very ragged on defense.

Cokeville lost to Hanna and Lyman and won from Encampment and Saratoga during the playoffs at Green River. The loss to Lyman gave the boys fourth place in the tournament.
