# CLASS OBITUARY

The class of 1957 passed away quietly and (?) peacefully on May 15, 1957, after a short but eventful life. Funeral services will be held on Friday, May 17, 1957, at 8:00 P.M.

We chose Miriam Mau as our president, and Mr. Birch bravely tackled us single-handed as our Class Advisor.

Our Sophomore year was off to a bang when we initiated the High School Fledglings, the Freshmen. That year too, '57 began to taste the unhealthy joys of night life. When we put on our Sophomore Hop, we decorated to the theme "Sleigh Ride". At this dance we honored the Student Body Queen, Mary Lu Walton.

During this year Norene Murdock grew restless and she gave us up for the marriage profession.

By her third year a once healthy class was showing definite signs of an approaching collapse. The dances and other activities were replaced by more dances and plays, and the curfew was gradually stretching to the wee hours of the morning. Dan Cupid started shooting his darts around indiscriminately with resultant sleepless nights and loss of appetite, and '57 began to get wrinkles around the eyes.

Our Junior year Lannie Petersen served as president, and Mrs. Somsen and Mr. Shaw, were our very capable advisors once again.

During our Junior year we put on our Junior Prom on February 11, 1956 after a month of complete frustration. The hall was beautifully decorated to the theme "Hawaiian Paradise". Jackie Mau reigned as queen.

Last but not least was our Junior Play "Girl Crazy," which we put on April 6, 1956. It was a western comedy in three acts. The place was a dude ranch in Arizona.

During this year we lost Larry Pugmire and Ralph Alley.

By last September it was obvious to all that the poor old class was making her last stand. Her eyes were bright, and feverish and her voice was pitched to an unnaturally high key.

By this time, '57 had begun to be aware of her scholastic shortcomings and in a desperate attempt to make up for short time, she spent long hours poring over her books and cramming for examinations.

We went into our Senior year with one additional classmate, Lynn Wigington whom we elected as our president. Mr. Dayton and Mr. Beecher were our advisors.

The class of '57 again took the spotlight when we put on the play, "The Miser", by Moliere, in full costume. We made history for C.H.S. by our sales intake on this production. This eventful performance took place on November 29, 1956. Mr. Coleman was our director.

The beginning of the end was on April 12, 1957, when we gave our Senior Ball. It was lavishly decorated to the theme "BANANA BOAT SONG", and the curtain came down on the last of the class of '57's High School Activities.

The unaccustomed activities only hastened her downfall, and by early spring '57 she knew that there was no hope and gave herself over to incoherent babblings about what she would wear when the end came and fearful wonderings about what was to come after this life.

And so the last week came and it was a hard one for her. She struggled to keep up her activities as long as her strength held out and we might well say that '57 died with her boots on.

But at last it is over, '57 has gone, and will be sadly missed by the faculty and underclassmen of Cokeville High School.

For, despite her many weaknesses, '57 was a lovable class in many ways. Cheerful and friendly and always eager to give of her talents for the glory of Cokeville High School. Her absence will be sorely felt on the gridiron, the basketball courts and the various other activities.

There is none of us so wise that we can predict what lies ahead for '57, but the whole school, we are sure, joins in the solemn wish that this is not the end, but merely the beginning of a new life for the gallant class that lived among us for four unforgettable years. Lived, perhaps not wisely, but well.
