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





# FOREWORD





The wholesome attitude of cooperation between students, faculty, and the administration is also greatly appreciated. All have worked to make this year a success.

## Seminary



The year 1935-36 has been a banner year in the history of the Star Valley Seminary. We have had eight class periods, including a class at 8:30 in the morning and one at seven o'clock in the evening. The total enrollment for the year exceeds two hundred fifty students, an increase of more than one hundred over last year.

At the request of local citizens, a class in Old Testament history was offered to adults. This class has been held once a week from seven to nine o'clock p. m. Due to unusually inclement weather, the class has been poorly attended, but those who did attend have enjoyed the course immensely.

The students purchased a projector to show still pictures. Funds for this purpose were raised by contributions and by sponsoring a picture at the Wray Theatre.

Forty students were graduated from the Seminary this year. Of this group, Osmond contributed the largest number. This class is composed of students who are the leaders among the students of the high school. They are also active in the auxiliary organizations of the wards in which they live.

## Vocational Agriculture



The Agricultural Department moved into a new building with a new teacher this year. There were thirty-three students taking Animal Production and twelve enrolled for Farm Management. The aim in the first class is to learn to do as far as possible those managerial and operative jobs that a boy needs in everyday livestock raising, while in Farm Management the major aim is to fit the boy for the job of successfully managing a farm. The shop work is part of the agricultural work and is intended to prepare the boy to do the simple woodwork, black-smithing, leather, rope, and cement jobs ordinarily needed on the farm.

This year one hundred per cent dues were collected in the Star Valley F. F. association, thus giving this chapter the largest vocational agriculture F. F. A. enrollment in the state. Some of the goals of the F. F. A. organization are to foster friendship and co-operation between farm boys enrolled in agriculture, to stimulate 95 per cent completion of projects, to promote more interest in community agricultural problems, and to prepare and enter better teams in F. F. A. contest. This year the F. F. A. organization and the Agricultural department have jointly published an article a week in the local newspaper on topics of agricultural interest.

## History Department



We have enrolled in the history department one hundred seventy-six students, eighty-five in American History and ninety-one in World History.

Some real statesmen and politicians have shown up in the history department this year. The courses we are completing have been interesting voyages of discovery and exploration, and we feel we would like to make further excursions into some of the by-ways of this field of study. For every individual is consciously or unconsciously a historian with a sense of time, with an innate feeling of how things have come about. 

## Wrestling and Boxing Team





After careful consideration an able cast, which represented all classes in school, was selected from a large group of contestants.






