To the Faculty we leave our ponies to guard from the hands of pilfering students.






In order to best serve our country—our community and our school we pledge our best efforts, first as true Americans. We resolve to uphold the standards and perform the duties of such.

These clubs are nationally sponsored and both send representatives to State Conventions.


They hold regular meetings and have several parties each year attended by the members of both clubs.

The Home Ec. Club annually stuff the cows for their "Barn Dance." The F.F.A. hold a father and sons banquet each year for all the members and their fathers.






