
Then there was Homecoming. Remember? Then there are the football games and the basketball games that will live in your memory.




DEAR SOPHOMORES:—

TO THE SENIORS


Oh, mighty Seniors, big and brave, The ones who are out in lead, You have won your post as graduates; The rest of the school you lead.
