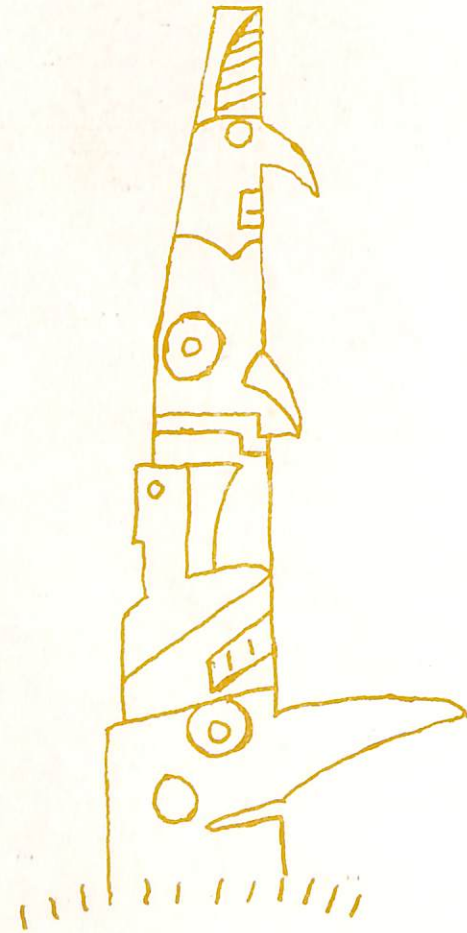
DEAR SOPHOMORES:—

The rest of the school you lead.*

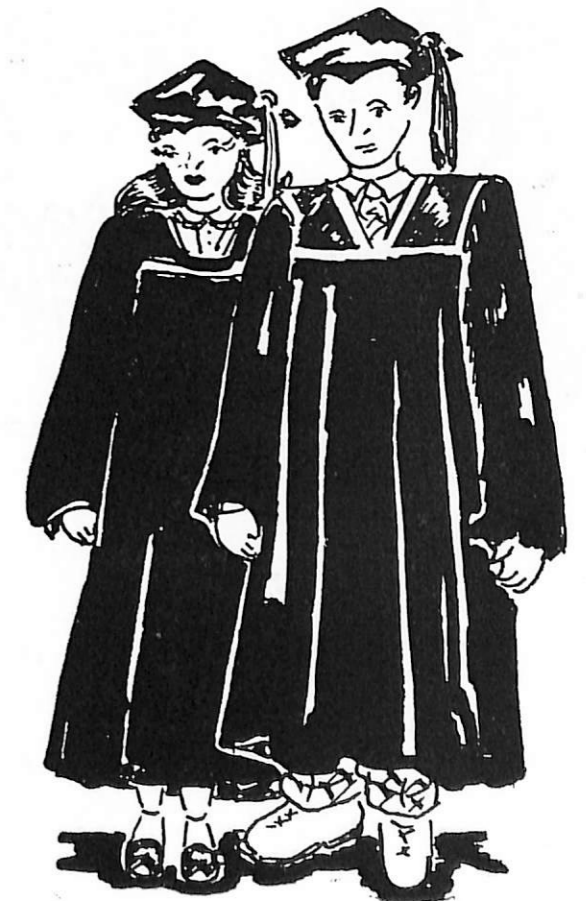
