For self-expression, leading to a respect and a love of the beautiful, students take art —creative painting, design, and crafts.






In emphasizing high standards of home and family life; sewing, cooking, etc., our home economics department excells.








Physical education and health train our students for physical fitness and sportsmanship through games and major sports.


