

We, the student body, elected Mary Jayne Christensen to reign over our 1955-1956 Homecoming activities.






Whether formal or casual Mary Jayne always flashed her brilliant smile and had a cheerful "hi-ya cutie" for everyone.

We chose these girls as attendants to Mary Jayne and they rode on the Queen's float in the big parade named, "Dear to Our Hearts."






ORGANIZATIONS
