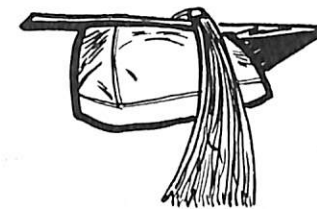

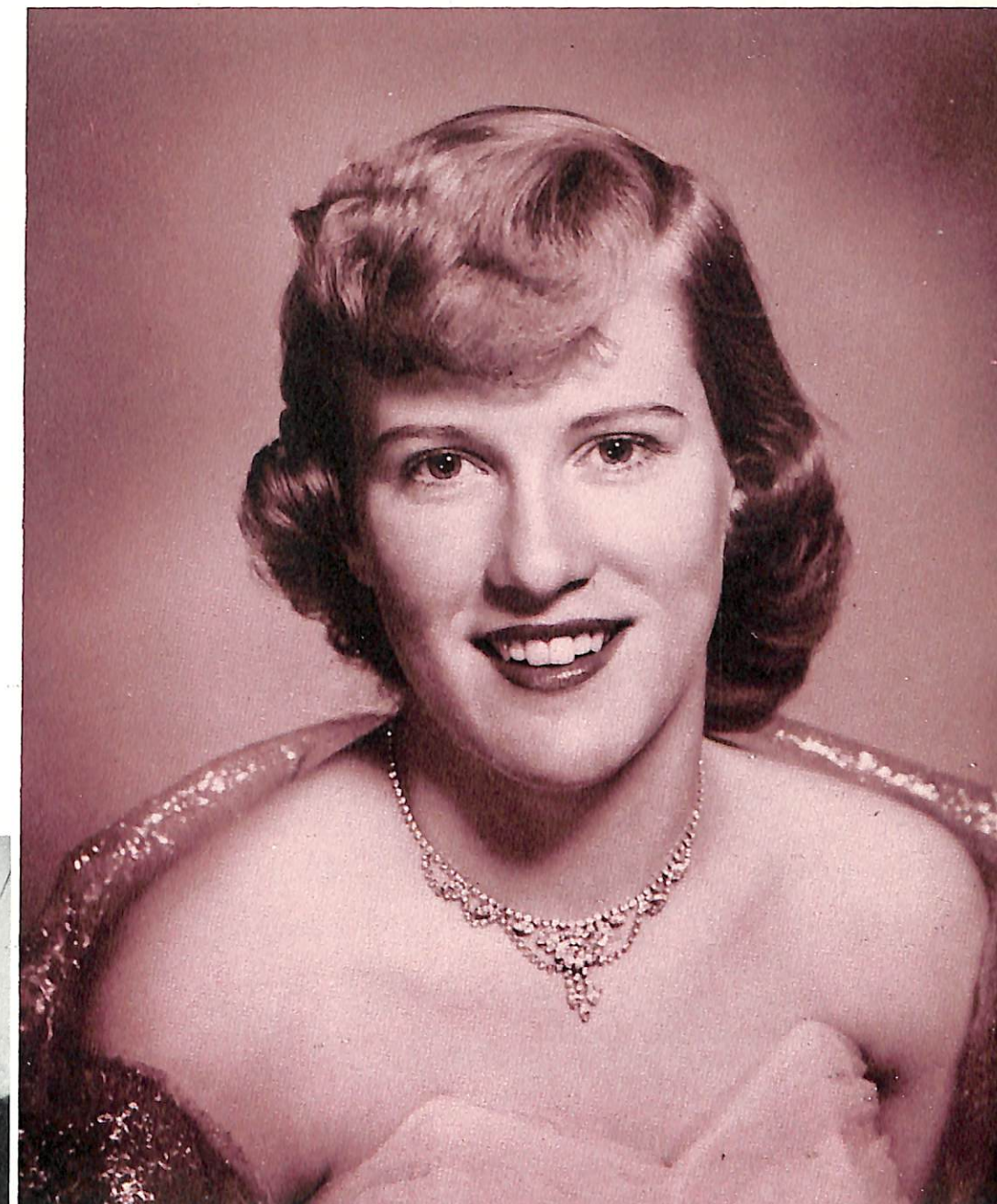

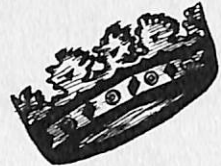
Scott

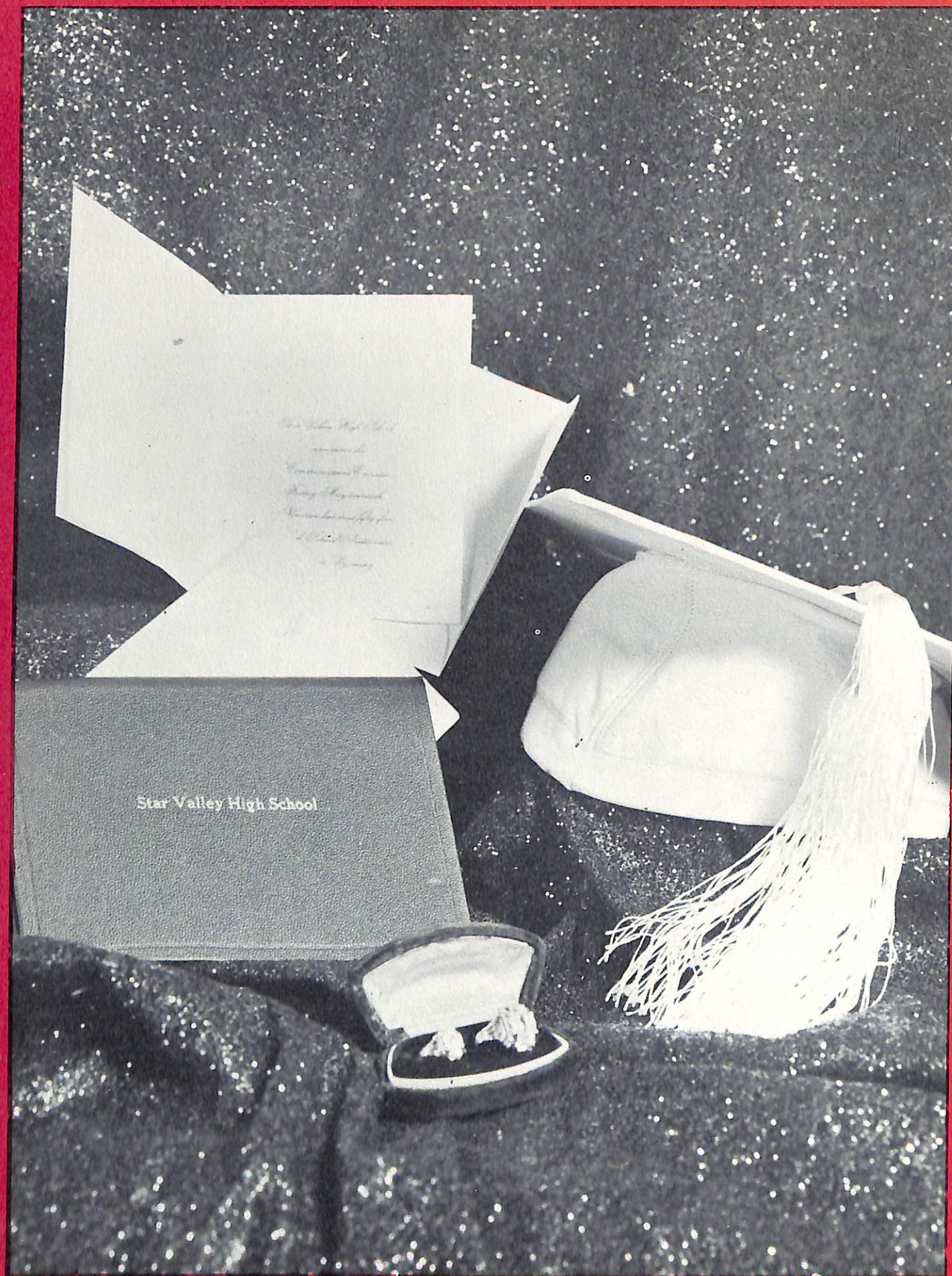


Whether formal or casual Mary Jayne always flashed her brilliant smile and had a cheerful "hi-ya cutie" for everyone.

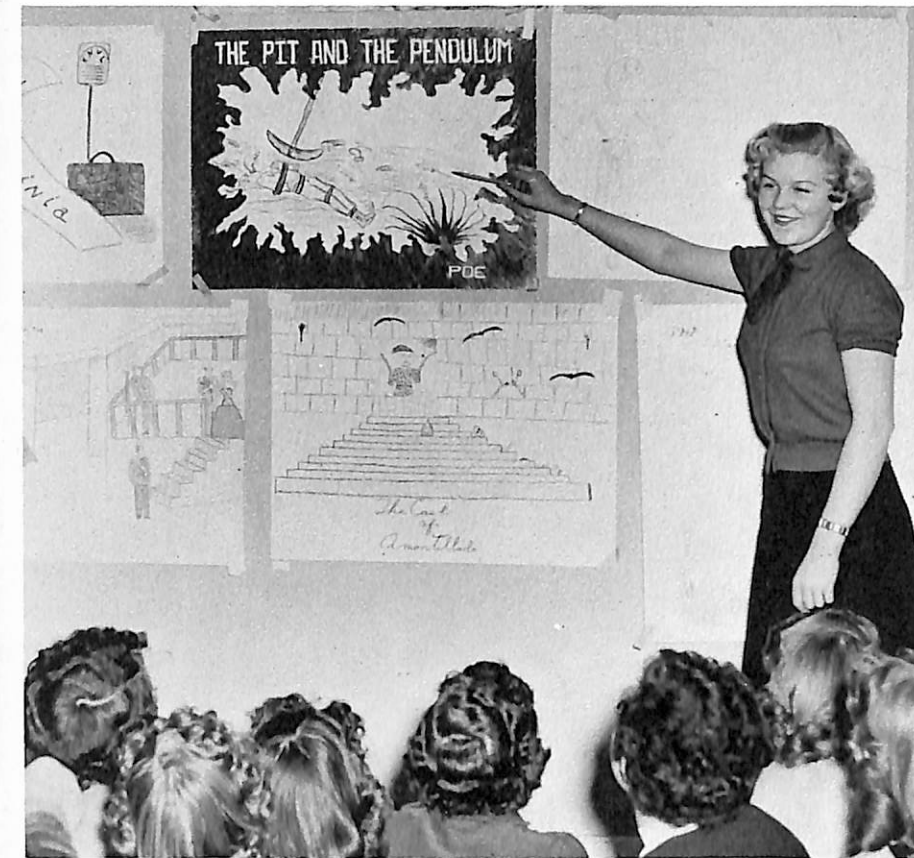

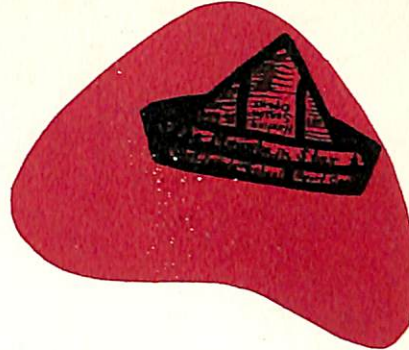
We stared in amazement and laughed with glee at the entertainers of the national school assemblies. We felt goose pimples as we watched films on current war news and teen-age driving tragedies.

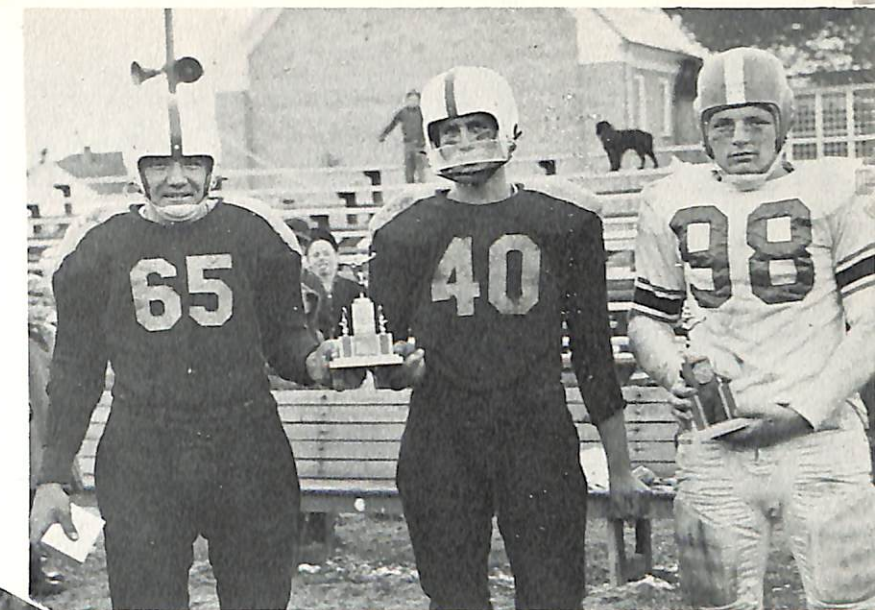
