


We are all very proud of the fine work which coach Lewis Monsen and Skip McCrary have done with this fine group of boys and wish them many more successful years at Star Valley High School.

At district tournaments, the Braves were eliminated after the first two games. Our opening game was against Green River. We played hard, but we lost by a score of 58-55. The Braves were then beaten by Jackson-Wilson 59-53; this defeat eliminated us from further play.

We are proud of our team and the work they put in on their sports participation. We owe much to our coach, Lewis Monsen and wish to say thanks for a job well done.
