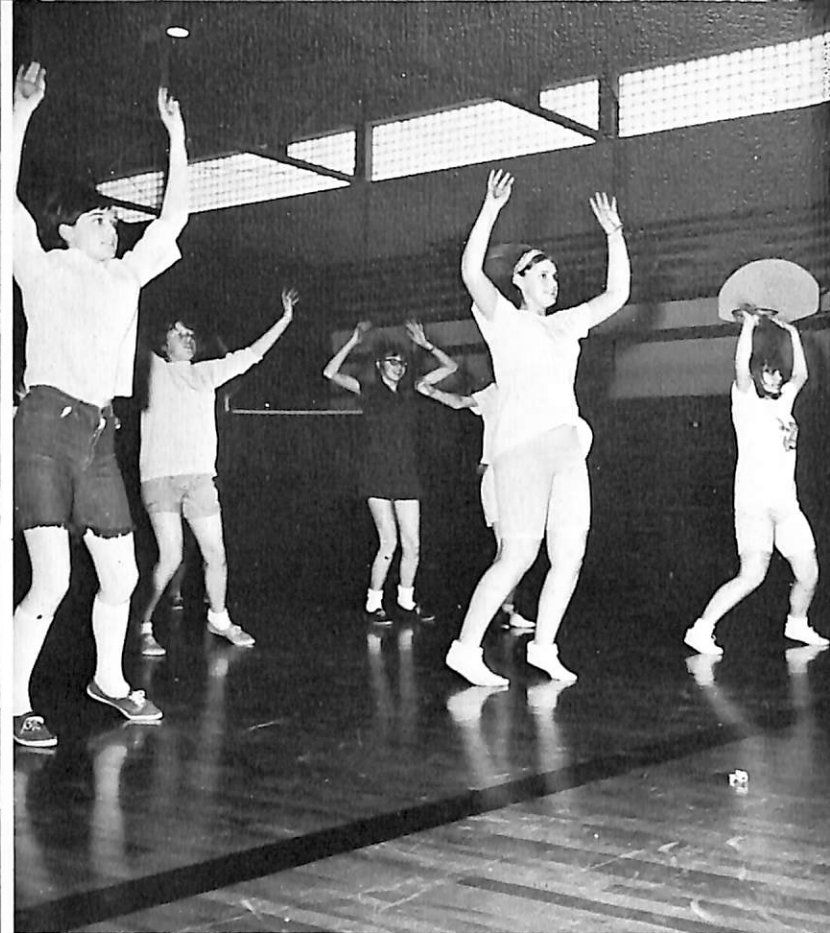


Our athletes have had a fabulous year, winning Class A State Championships in Football, Basketball, and Wrestling. An accomplishment not ever equalled by any other school in the state.

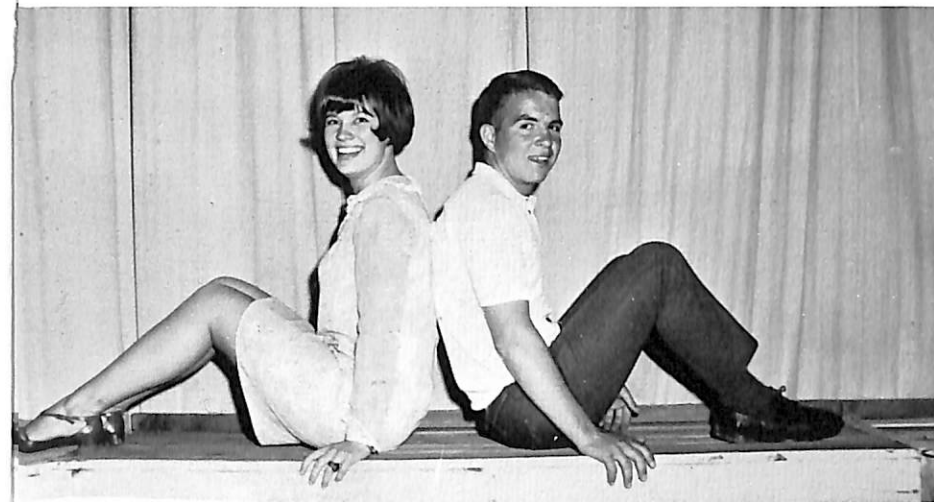

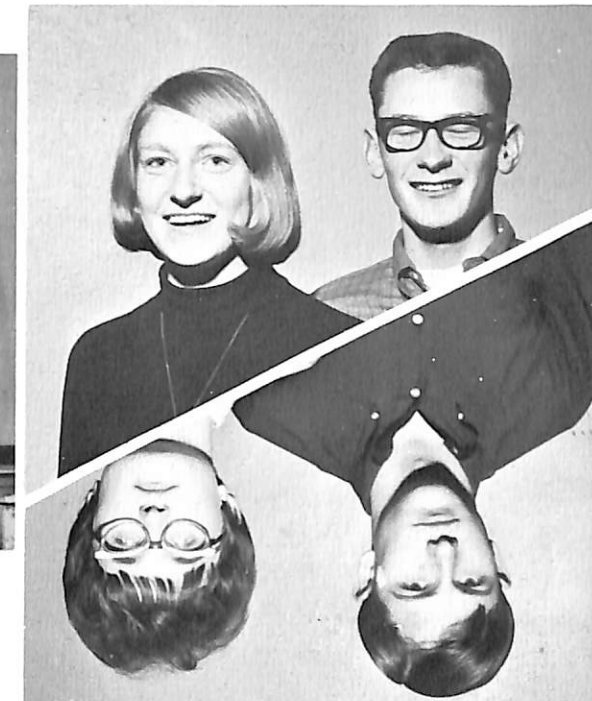

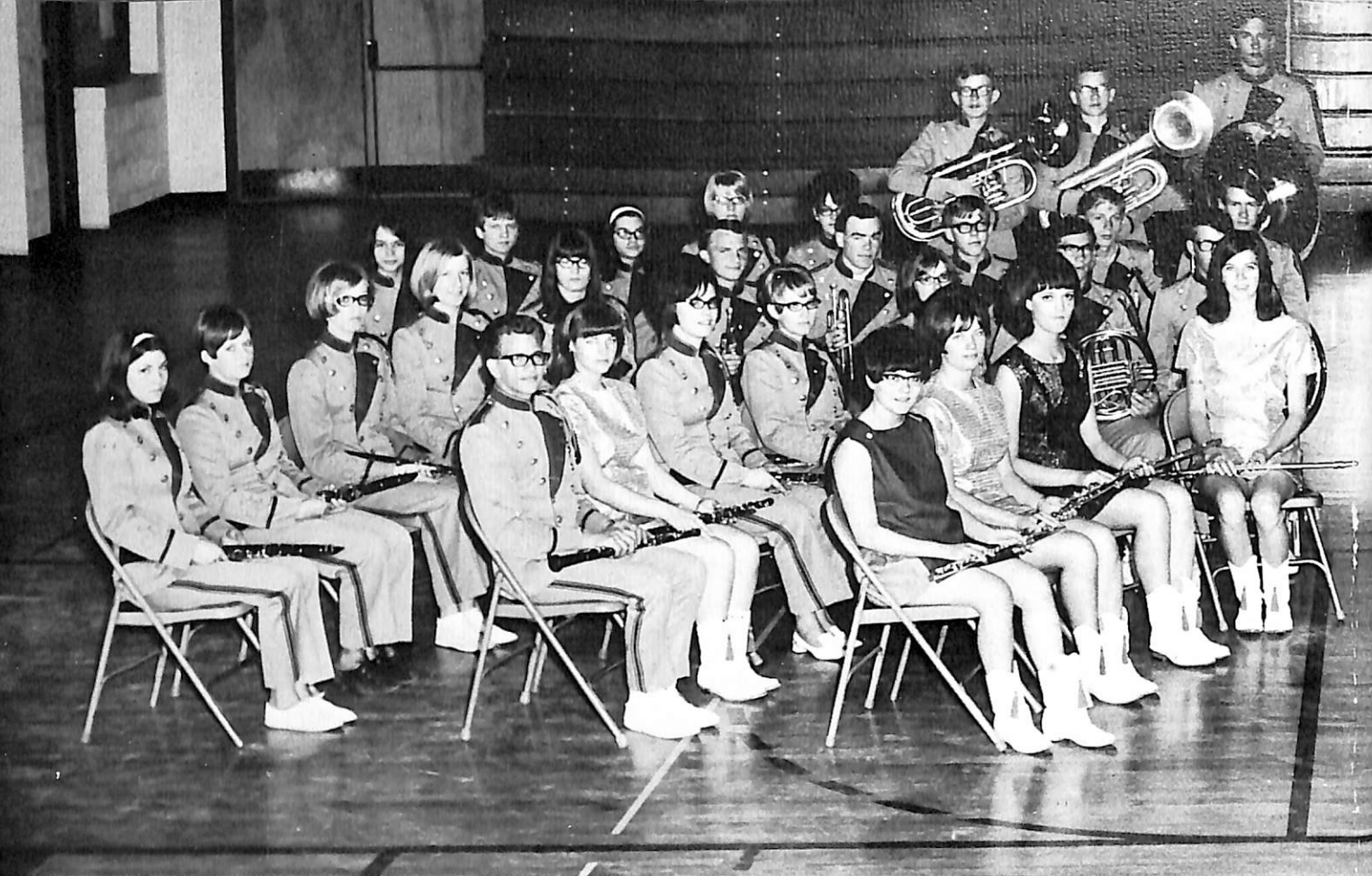
"Long Live The Mayor"

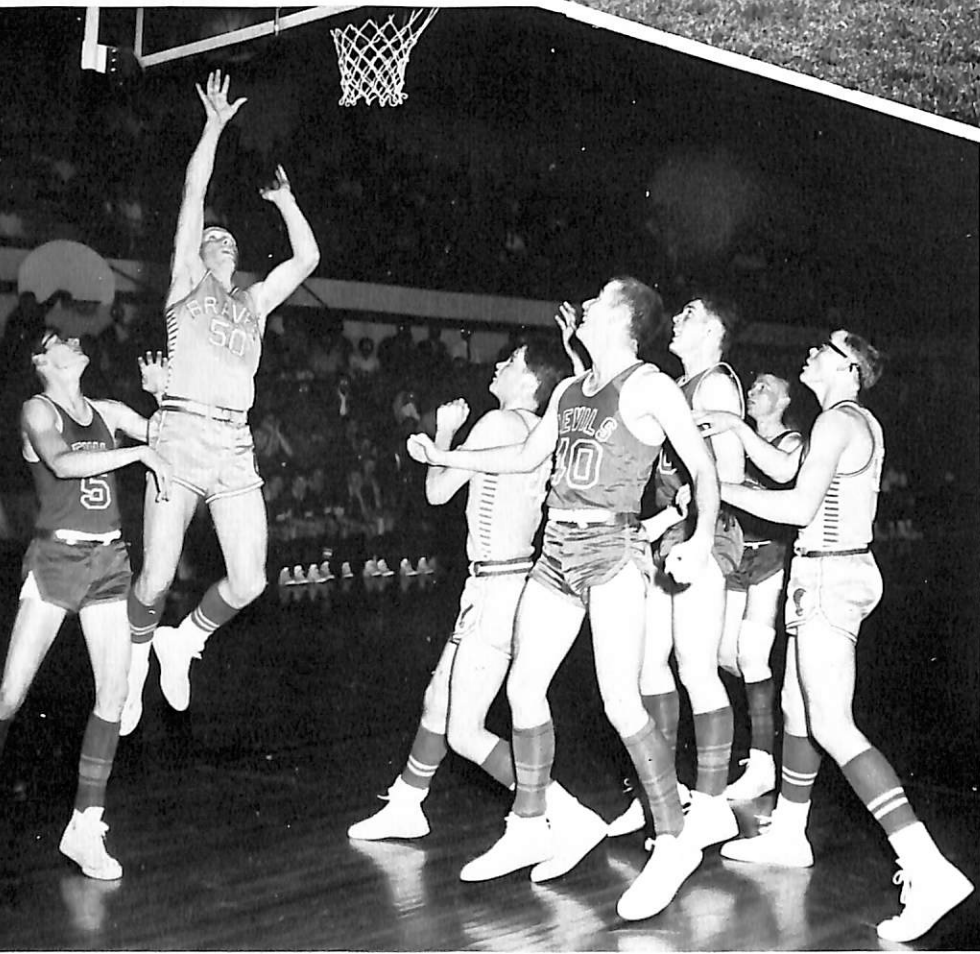

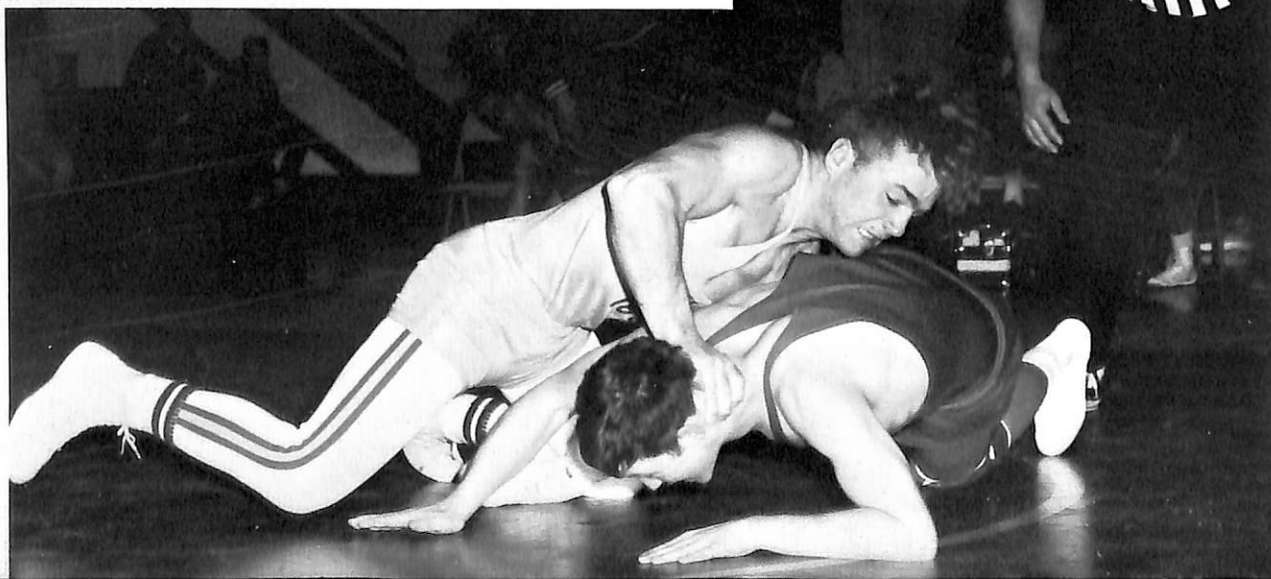
