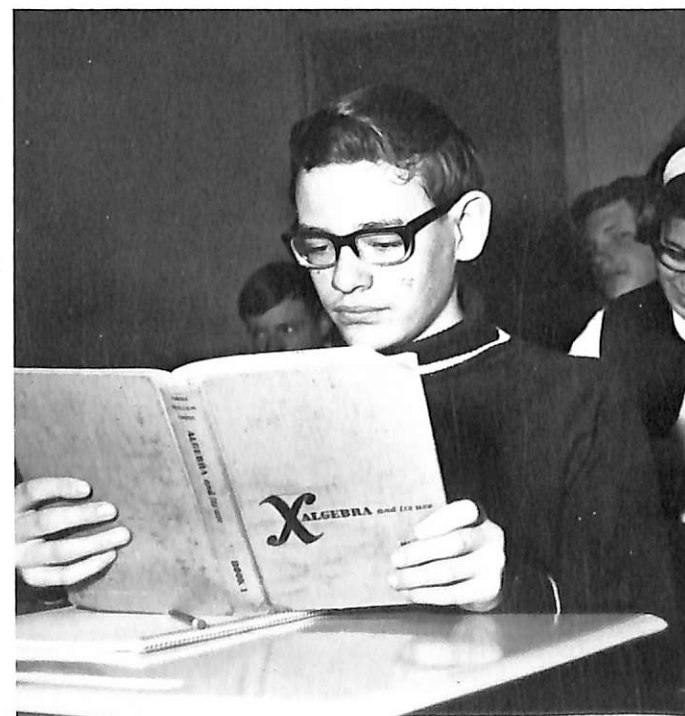
Through the practice of Jr. Legislature in the Problems of Democracy class, students learn of the duties which must be done before a country can PROGRESS.

PROGRESS in a class is determined by the amount of concentration that a student puts forth.



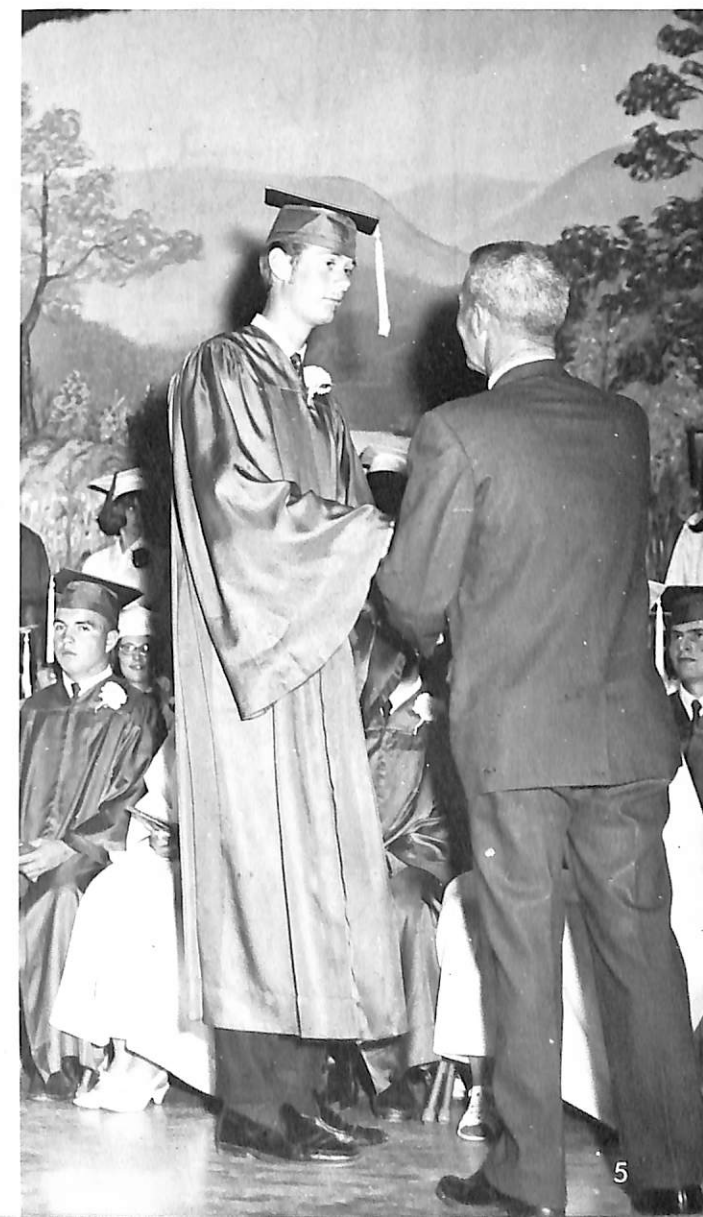

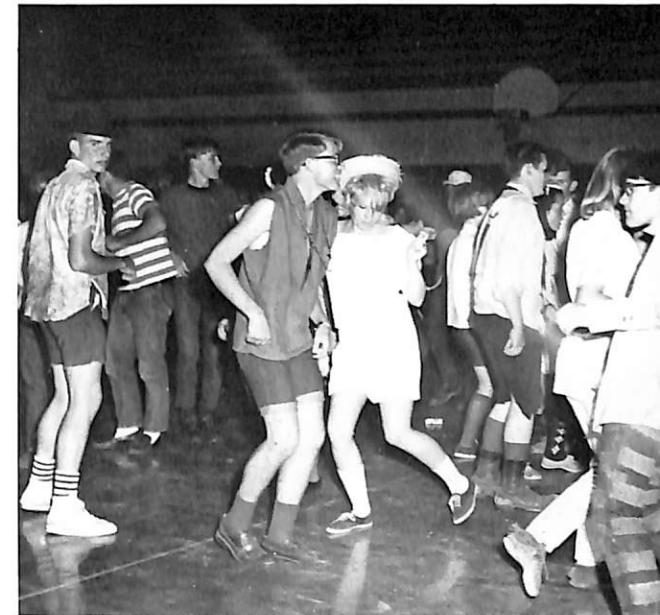
Free to Participate.

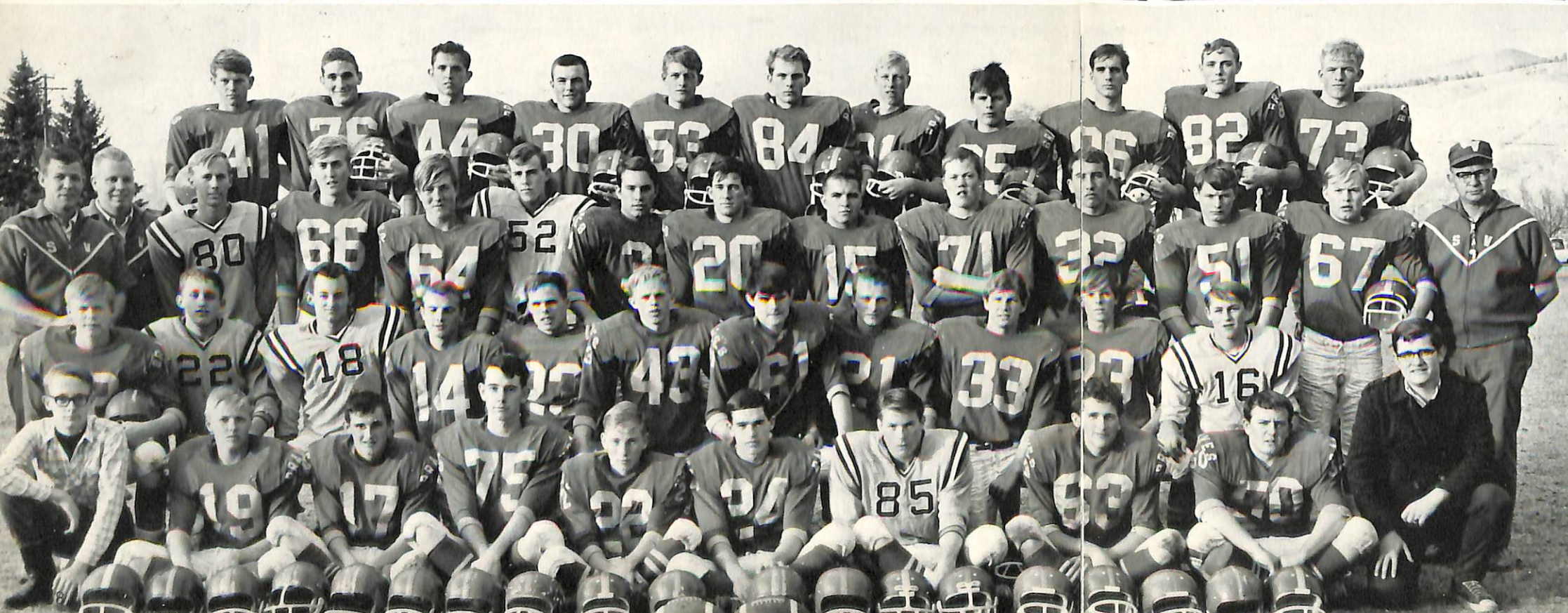
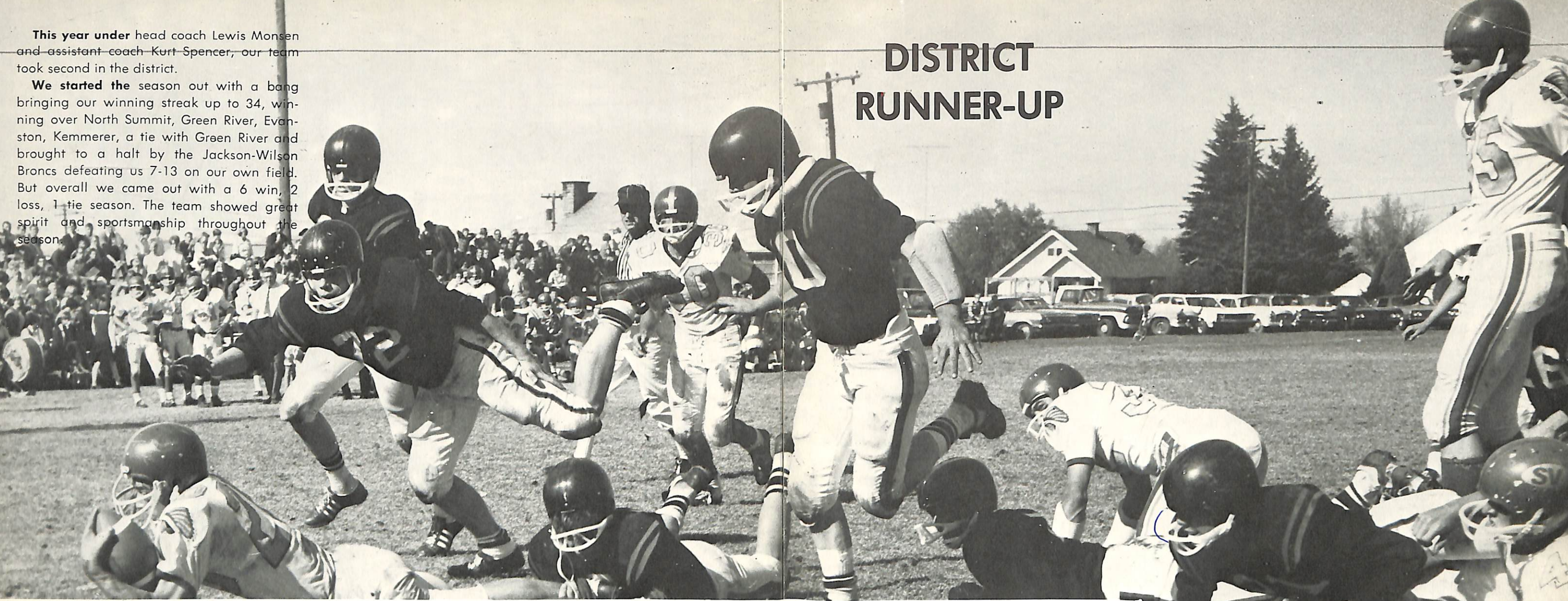
ATHLETICS

At district tournament the Braves won their first game against Kemmerer 48-69, but lost the final two to Jackson 48-46, and Evanston 67-57.

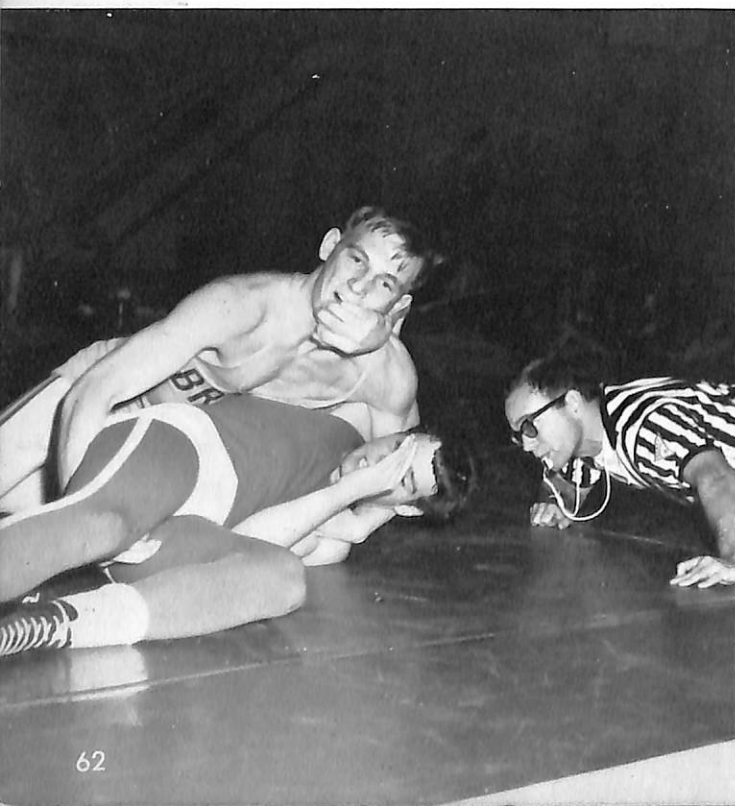
