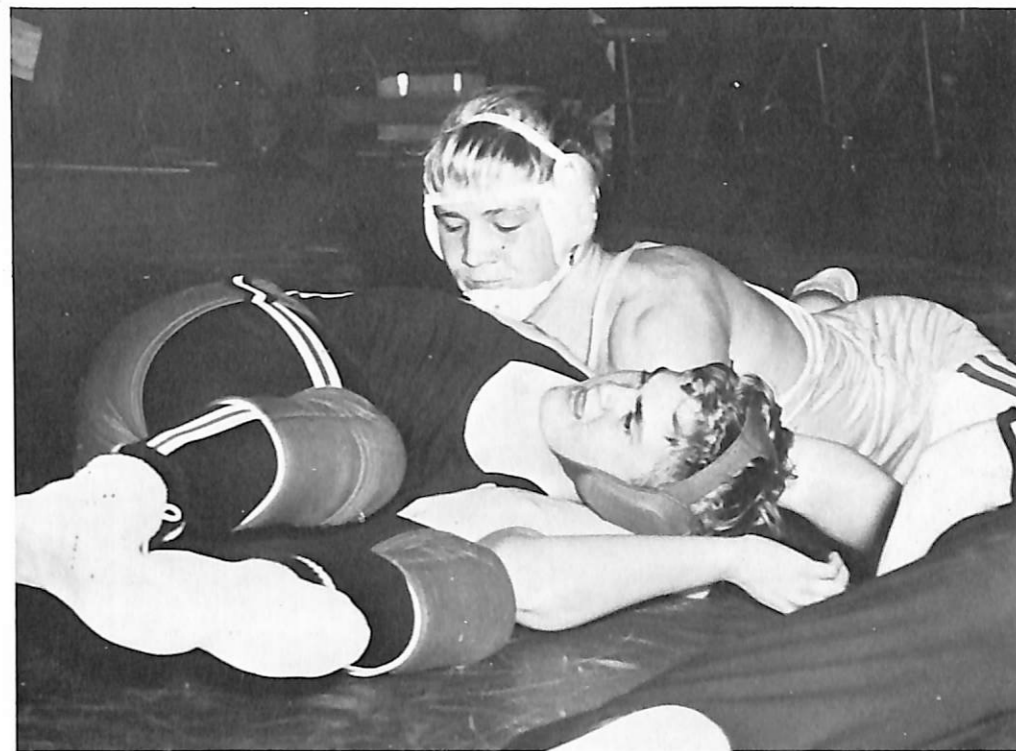

The Braves placed second at District by defeating Green River in an overtime but lost to Jackson in the finals. Having no luck at state, our season ended by losing to Buffalo by only two points.

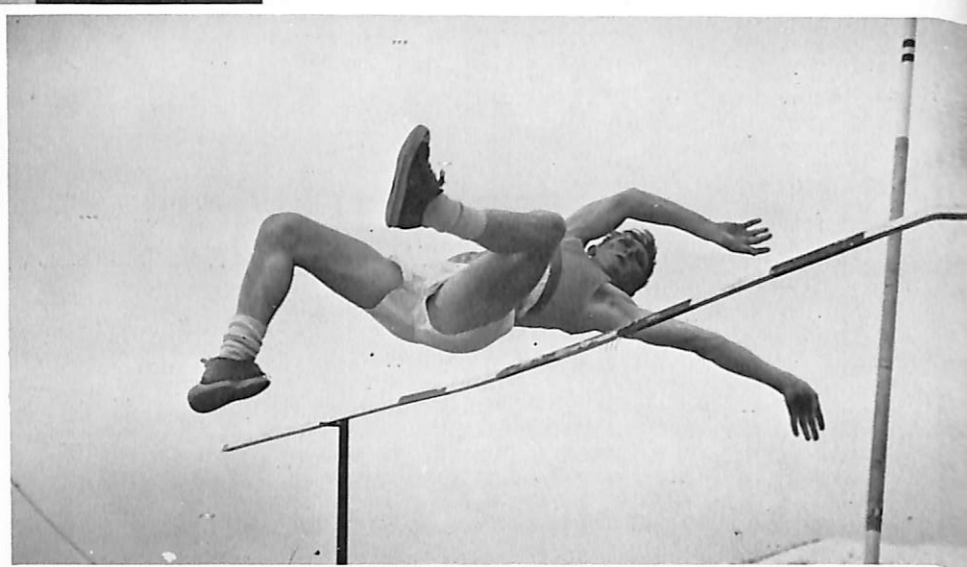

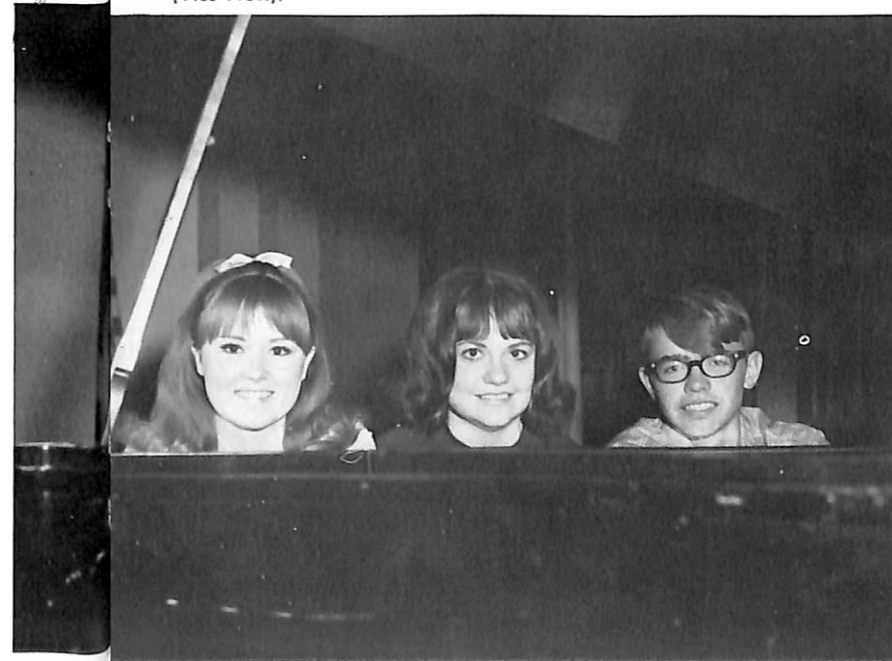
