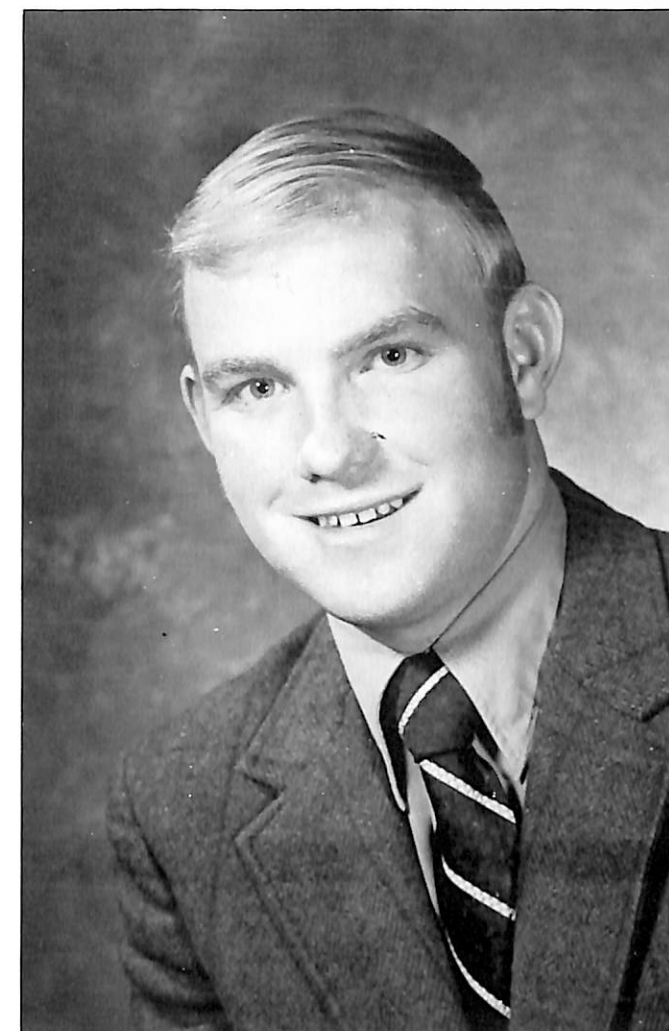


Student Body President

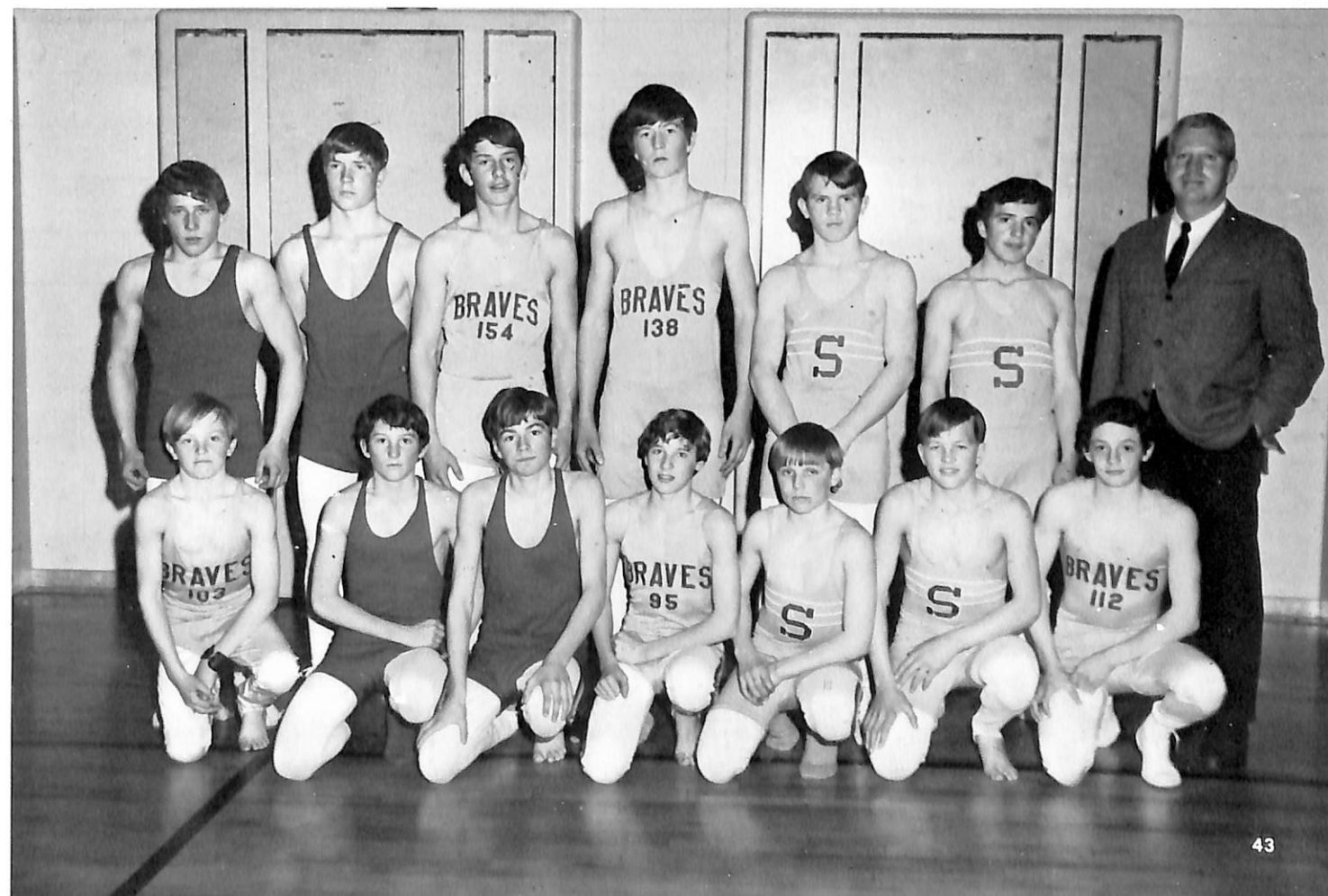


KIM WEST, first in state

In a long hard struggle in which Star Valley placed eight men, with one of them a state champ. Star Valley defeated Newcastle's hopes for a second championship. Star Valley matmen came through when it counted and sneaked by Newcastle with a final score of Star Valley 72½ to Newcastle's 66 for Star Valley's second championship.

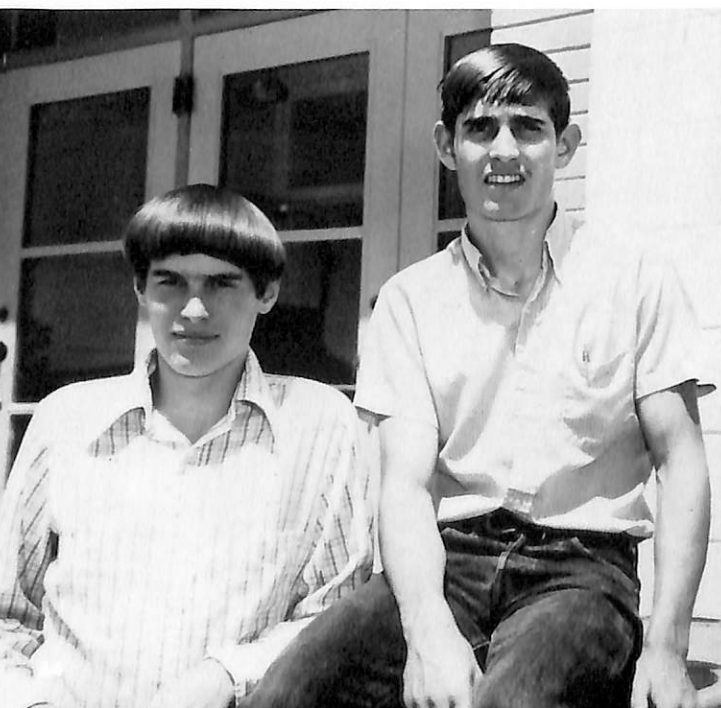

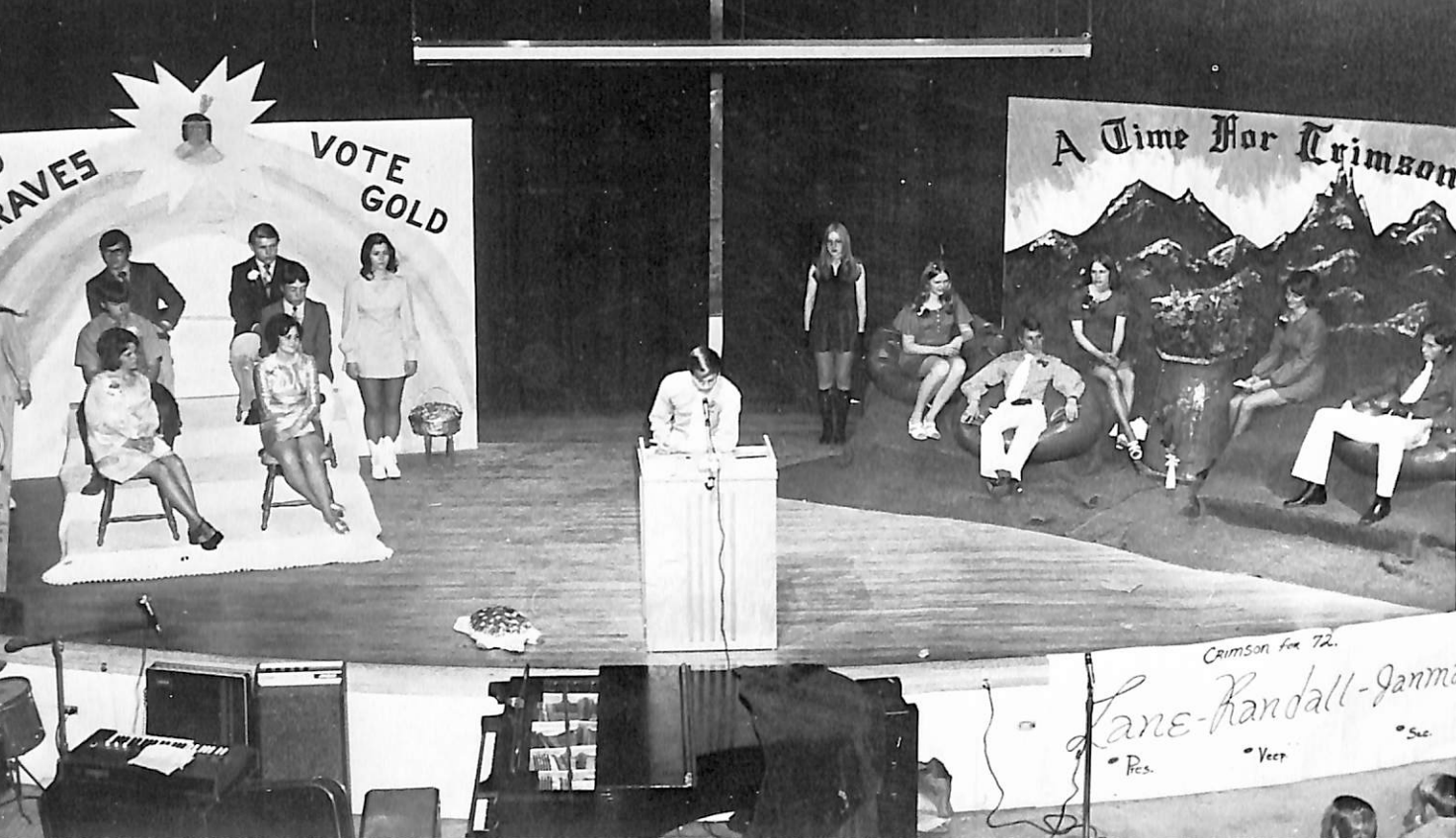
