



Under the direction of company representatives Lynne Eckburg and Tom Lowe, 760 copies of Star Valley High School's 1997 yearbook, "Inside, Outside" were printed by Herff Jones Inc. of Logan Utah. The cover, end sheets, folios and division pages were designed by editors Lisa Hunsaker and Ginger Weber. Body copy and captions were printed in the fonts Jester and Boulder in various sizes. The spot color Silver, Pearlescent Aspen Blue, Pearlescent Berry, and Pearlescent Heather were used throughout the book in a variate of shades. Photos were taken and printed by the Journalism Photography students under the direction of Dianna Cazier, with the exception of the Senior and Underclassmen portraits which were taken by Phill Grosjean, Laura Axford, and Life Touch National School Studios.

The 20 member staff met the challenge of producing the 224 page book. With hard work and long hours of dedication and organization together we produced an outstanding, creative, and dynamic yearbook for 1997.
